Newsletter - July 2012

The last couple of months have been very busy with the Jubilee weekend celebrations, European championship football, the Olympic flame activities and now Wimbledon. Ecclesbourne Valley Railway at Duffield Junction - Radio Station Easter 2012

To celebrate the first anniversary of the re-opening of the railway line from Wirksworth to Duffield, the people of the Ecclesbourne Valley Railway allowed us to put up our Club gazebo at the end of their platform.

There we put up dipoles for 40m and 20m and a collinear for 2m FM and GX2DJ went on the air.

We did not do too badly on Saturday, not forgetting we are there to also publicise amateur radio and not just to work stations and ignore the public. Regrettably we weren't able to operate on the Sunday due to a lack of operators, but we were able to put the station back together again on the Monday accompanied by almost incessant rain.

Bands were suffering badly so our using an end-fed aerial wasn't able to be fully appreciated.

As the railway lock their station and facilities as soon as the last

National Mills Weekend - May 2012

There's only one stone windmill with 6 sails working in the UK and that's at Heage near the town of Belper in Derbyshire. Nunsfield House ARG has operated from that site for several years using GB5HW and once more

DADARS were invited to go and assist. Once the tent was up, mains connected, kettle on, mast extended with the 80/40 dipole and the Cushcraft R5 vertical aerials connected to the Groups radio by about 10:45 - after a coffee of course!

With quite restrictive opening times we tried what we could to work as many other Mills stations as possible and over both days with yet again awful band conditions 38 stations on 40m, 5 on 80m, 10 on 20m, 1 on 15m and 2 on 17m.

We could hear stations in East Coast USA, Japan, Greenland, Canada, etc., but just couldn't work them. However, there were visitors asking what it was all

Olympic Torch (June)

Our plans to support the Olympic torch celebrations were dashed last month due to refusal by Derby City Council to accommodate us at Darley Park or other official venues on 29th and 30th June 2012. It seems all decisions must go through LOCOG (London Organising Committee of the Olympic and Paralympic Games), who on this occasion, expressed concern about the "amount of radio frequencies in use and, consequently, possible interference with broadcasts by the local event organisers, LOCOG and the emergency services".

We planned the position of our radio station well away from the main activities and crowds so interference was highly unlikely. However, as a club, we must respect Derby City Council's arbitrary decision and avoid occupying revenue-making space. As such, we abandoned the event, which is a shame.

G-QRP and Contests

The club is now affiliated with the G-QRP club. Activity since February has been slow due mainly to people being unavailable for one reason or another. We did intend to support the Valve/Fun Day in April but, unfortunately, we had to cancel it.

The club supported the OK/OL QRP contest on 24th February 2012 from the clubroom using G2DJ. We worked 10 stations on CW and claimed 28 points. Details of the contest are on http://okqrp.fud.cz/. The results are out and we did well by not coming last.

Our contest manager Kevin (G4CMZ) is in the process of assessing a potential field day site near Melbourne in Derby. This requires considerable planning and support to make the event successful. Being a realist, Kevin doubts if this will happen this year but something to look forward to in the future. With all the rainfall this year, it may be a good idea to delay it to next year. If we have excess rain this year then next year we should have excess sun - well that is the theory.

Below is a list of contests we are proposing to enter in the coming months. As can be seen the mode is SSB which hopefully will encourage others to come onboard and have fun. The prime aim is to get DADARS and

DWC back on the contest trail after a much too long absence. In Kevin's opinion, the club needs to get back to grass roots level. Many successful clubs regularly enter contests and do well despite having membership sizes similar or less than ours.

Getting back to the proposed contests, the majority are short (1.5 hrs) to very short (1hr). The RSGB 21/28 MHz event could be interesting as we have reasonable antennas in place.


SNADARC and G-QRP Rally
